Cashmere's Ninetieth Birthday

The Cashmere Croquet Club celebrates its 90th year in 2014. The establishment of a sports club in 1924 came about from the incorporation of a private company, Cashmere Hills Recreation Club Limited, and the purchase of land for the three sports still on site in Valley Road. Croquet, bowls and tennis still thrive in our idyllic setting, handy to Cashmere Road and nestled in a sheltered valley surrounded by quality housing. Our event to mark this auspicious occasion at the end of the season will be a themed 1920s costume croquet afternoon with afternoon tea. Readers who have had a previous association with our club are welcome to attend the closing day event on Saturday 3rd May. In the early part of the 2014–15 season, a combined clubs' celebration is proposed.

The club has two full size lawns which were freshly laid in the autumn of 2010. Fortunately, the seismic events of 2010 and following caused little damage but ground settlement and drainage remains a minor problem.

We maintain our membership at around 50 players but are concerned that association croquet does not have the same attraction as golf. On Monday and Friday afternoons and Wednesday morning, 20-25 members play Golf Croquet. Association players meet on Saturday afternoons and a trial of sharing club days with St Martins and Barrington proved to be worthy of repeating next season.

The clubhouse is adequate for 30-40 visitors and is available for other activities, mah jong on Sunday afternoons and bridge on Tuesday evenings. We also promote corporate and private social events.

The club also encourages
members to meet socially with monthly
Sunday barbeques integrating golf and
association members. We like to visit
other clubs to play croquet and mix with
our peers, and this year will send a
delegation to Akaroa.
