Planning is already underway for the NZ AC Open Championship which is being held at United on 20-27 January 2024.



There was a successful initiative a couple of years ago to get new GC referees within CCA, but we are now in the situation where we may soon have only half a dozen or so readily available qualified referees.

Consequently, we need to have another drive to get new referees involved in the game. Ideally, we should be looking at least one qualified referee per club and it shouldn't take much for any player to hone their knowledge to enable them to pass the referees assessment and become qualified.

There are inevitably those gnarly situations that need a closer look at the rule book and the intention is to run a few sessions early in December to prepare people for assessment in the New Year. These will address topics such as wrong ball, faults, interference, offside etc as well as dealing with particular subjects that those attending may want to raise.

You will be surprised by how much you do actually know already so please have a think about it and contact me if you have any further questions and/or you want to put your name down to become a referee.

Even if you don't initially want to become a referee, you would be more than welcome to come to the sessions to "sharpen up" your knowledge.

So that we can plan the sessions, could you please contact me by 25<sup>th</sup> November.

Whilst I am principally a GC player and referee, I am also aware that there is a similar shortage of Umpires in the AC world so we should also be looking to have more of these as well. Again, if anyone is interested in becoming an AC Umpire, get in touch with me and we will see what arrangements can be made to get you qualified.
